# CHILDREN OF THE WORLD, DELHI (CWD)

FINANCIAL YEAR 2016-2017

Children of the World in Delhi has completed 26 years in service of children in need. Destitute children who are unwanted, abandoned, lost or relinquished are in urgent need for shelter and protection in a Child Care Centre. On admission they need a medical check-up and prompt treatment if required. Added to balanced diet, every child needs personal care and huge hugs of love and warmth. Children start blossoming and dreaming of a happy life in future. Ultimately the institution becomes a precious home for them. This is the stage when steps are taken to rehabilitate them through adoption after due legal, medical and social clearances by the authorities.

On the other hand the children living in poverty stricken families are also as needy. Their health, nutritious diet and education have no priority in the daily struggle of making ends meet. This is truer in cases where gender discrimination is strongly indoctrinated. First generation learners have no guidance or motivation from the parents and are likely to perpetuate the old values, with zero progress in the rapidly changing times.

Recognizing the needs of these two categories of children, without families and with families, CWD started two projects 'Mamta' an Adoption Programme for destitute children and Pragati a sponsorship programme for children of financially depressed families in Manglapuri.

At 'Mamta' the attention for a third category of needy children has arisen quite sharply. These children are physically or mentally challenged. Their rehabilitation through adoption is near impossible.

Except for languishing at 'Mamta' they have no future. Actually 'Mamta' is not equipped to handle children with special needs. The special institutions which can help are not willing to admit them because those are already over full.

The inspiration to start a special therapeutic project came from 'Mamta' care givers Premvati and Bimla. These two attendants Premvati and Bimla have been very affectionate and deeply caring, noticing their needs through their gestures making them comfortable. There are nine children in this category, some from birth and others as toddlers or slightly older. Radhika the warden at 'Mamta' has been a devoted person, who guides the care-givers in daily routine and in an emergency.

Some visitors at 'Mamta' have become long term donors for this project. They have taken active interest in providing therapeutic treatment at well established centres which would otherwise be not affordable for Mamta due to its limited resources. With regular therapy the children certainly showed improvement in their reaction and looked happy. Picnics and outings have been arranged for these children. A flicker of recognition and a smile is worth all the effort that compassion and love can produce.

Donors suggested that they could buy the equipment required for therapy at Mamta. The therapist would come to Mamta to treat the children.

Physically and mentally challenged children need constant stimulus to activate their reactions. They cannot be left alone to vegetate.

# ADOPTION PROGRAMME

Since its inception in 1991 Mamta has received about 750 children who needed immediate shelter and protection. Mamta has all the facilities to look after children who need not only shelter and protection but also rehabilitation through adoption or special care owing to physical or mental disabilities. The centre is well equipped with appropriate staff such as Social workers, Doctors, Therapists, Nurses and Care givers. Mamta aims to provide Quality Institutional Care for its children.

Each Child at the time of admission in “Mamta” is photographed after a thorough medical check -up. Efforts are made to restore the Child to its Biological family, failing which the Child needs rehabilitation. “Mamta” does not believe in long term institutionalization because every child has a right to a family.

While the Children are under Mamta’s care, regular schedule is planned for their daily routine, from morning till evening. Their diet is well planned and well balanced. Diet plays very important roll in nourishing the children who sometimes come half-starved, hungry and famished. Their physical growth suffers due to lack of proper nutrition.

Case histories and medical reports of each and every child is maintained in individual files and updated from time to time. This is essential for not only the adoptive parents but also to keep a check on the Child’s growth and development.

Mamta’s activities are planned at three levels. At the Nursery level, the Children are looked after by the care givers. Their diet and nutrition is planned according to their needs. The toddlers need special activities to keep them busy and occupied and monitor their mental and physical development. This information is shared with the respective adoptive parents at the later stage. Older children at Mamta attend a near-by school. Their day starts at 6am. After returning from the school at 2 pm, the kids have lunch followed by a short nap. In the afternoons they play outdoors. In the evenings it is television time, dinner and then bed time around 9.30 pm.

Older Children from the age of 6-10 years attend a near-by school. Younger Children at “Mamta” are taken care of by volunteers who engage these Children in various extra curricular activities like music and dance, painting and drawing etc. All these activities are carried out on a daily basis at a fixed time. Mrs. S. Dhatta has been a regular honorary teacher at ‘Mamta’, teaching all the children the three ‘R’s i.e. reading, writing and arithmetic with love and affection. CWD is grateful to her.

For entertainment of Children there are plenty of toys, simple books, television, regular picnics and outings and they also get invited to others institutions on special events such as Christmas, Diwali etc. Our Children enjoy traditional functions like Rakshabandhan, Janamashtami (Lord Krishna's Birthday) etc. They specifically look forward to Holi- Festival of Colours and Diwali- Festival of lights. In addition to these, our Children also celebrate National Festivals like Independence day and Republic day. All the festivals hold special importance for these Children at Mamta because there are loads of food, sweets and fruits to relish. New clothes to deck up in and songs, dances and skits that are put up by older children.

Each Child's birthday is celebrated with a cake and some sweets which are distributed amongst all.

## **Medical**

All the children have to undergo a blood test on regular basis. They are also medically examined by the Doctor which is recorded in their respective Medical files.

A Child Study Report (CSR) and a Medical Examination Report (MER) is regularly maintained, dated and updated. This is an important document because the Adoptive parents like to share all the information about the Child. This gives them a feeling they have been with the Child from the very beginning. An album is prepared for each child, showing its various activities which the adoptive parents want to preserve.

## **Unadoptable Children**

The project for in-house therapy for the Special needs children has already started where a trained Physiotherapist visits Mamta center daily and gives individual session to these children. There is a remarkable improvement in them. Fortnightly case discussions will be undertaken to pin-point the individual needs of each child for its progress.

# SPONSORSHIP PROGRAMME

Children of the World Delhi has its second project – Pragati a remedial class at Manglapuri. Pragati provides Sponsorship aid to needy Children who are living in financially depressed families. The primary objective of Pragati is to promote education amongst the Children of poor classes, with special emphasis on education for girls. A room has been hired at Manglapuri to start a remedial class for sponsored Children. These Children are selected according to a certain criteria ensuring the families motivation, length of stay in the community and cooperation with the social workers.

Children come to this class after their regular school. There are two field-level social workers who manage the remedial class. Children are helped with extra coaching, studies and also with the homework given by the school. This is essential as most of the children belong to parents who have never been to a school. These children are first generation learners.

CWD has also organized a medical clinic where a doctor examines each child and prescribes medicines as required. The medical services are provided to the families and even to the members of the community without any charge. The doctor makes weekly visits.

Pragati has extra-curricular activities also. Children learn music, dancing, painting, colouring and other traditional arts. They enjoy picnics and outings. During festival season, children are invited by other organizations to take part in songs, skits and dances. Pragati children have won prizes in these competitions.

Pragati has formed a “MahilaMandal” (mother’s group). A close contact with this group helps the workers to know the family because Child is an integral part of its family. The Mother’s have been explained the purpose of setting up remedial class and how it would help their Children to educate themselves and improve their living conditions if they are skilled and qualified. The initial purpose in having a close contact with the women is to discuss their problems and try to find solutions. In addition, problems like health and hygiene, gender discrimination, superstition and Child marriage are also discussed. There is a day fixed for Mothers Picnic every year. They look forward to it to have a break from the shackles of kitchen life.

## **Special Programmes at Pragati**

1. Eye Surgeries:Prara Professionals at Pragati worked very hard to take these patients to the Eye Hospital at D.D. U.(Deen Dayal Upadhayaya Hospital) and got the surgeries done. Around 15 eye surgeries were conducted in the last 3 years successfully.

2. Sewing Classes: In order to promote income generation amongst women the sewing class provides the facility to learn to stitch simple clothes of daily use. There are 5 donated sewing machines and five to six women come to the class daily. During festivals and marriage season most of them are absent. During summer vacations, the older girls in the sponsorship group also learn sewing along with their studies. So far about 15 women have started earning a living after completing their course at Manglapuri.
3. Special care for TB patients: Considering TB is rampant in the community causing joblessness and financial strain, Pragati took the initiative of a small scale project for TB patients. The workers do not accept more than 7 patients at a time to be counselled, medicated and given full nutritional aid. This project was started 3 years ago and so far 11 patients have been fully cured and have rejoined their jobs. With a small number it is easier to give focused attention for continuous treatment, regular counselling and nutrition. Weekly and monthly rations in the form of eggs, fruits, milk, vegetable and household grocery items are given to the entire family. This has helped the families to look more cheerful and help the patient recover from TB.

The Field level workers Brijbal and Balbir have shown a lot of initiative and hard work to organize various activities and projects at Pragati.

#### **Activities at 'Pragati'**

All the national celebrations such as Independence Day on 15th August, Republic Day on 26th January and Children's Day on 14th November were organized with Flag Hoisting, National Anthem and some dances and plays by the Children. On Children's Day CWD had put up a stall showing various crafts work made by our sponsored Children in a fair organized by "Gurgaon Connection". They made small pots with mud and painted them in beautiful colours. Girls applied Henna on the visitors hands for which they were paid.

A picnic was arranged at the Delhi zoo in the last week of February, 2017. Kids really enjoyed the trip. Before entering the Zoo the kids were given a small talk on Zoo manners like not to tease the animals, not to offer eatables to the animals and not to litter in the Zoo. They all used the dust bin which was rather encouraging for the social worker.

CWD celebrated its 26th Annual Day on 27th of January, 2017. Children put up group dances from Rajasthan, Haryana and also from Bollywood Movies. The girls looked beautiful in their costumes. They also performed plays and group songs. One particular play was to promote Girls education which was really appreciated by all the guests. At the end of the show food packets and blankets were distributed

among the children.

Every year Genesis Foundation organizes an annual picnic for sponsored Children. This year the picnic was organized on 18th December, 2016. All the kids thoroughly enjoyed themselves.

A workshop was conducted by Apeejay School of management (MBA School) on “Mental and Sexual Abuse”. This was a very educative talk which was duly attended by all the sponsored Children.

In December, 2017 TATA Water filters organized free distribution of Water filters in the Community. These water filters were distributed among the families of Sponsored as well as non-sponsored Children. Contaminated water and water borne diseases is a major problem in this poverty stricken community of our sponsored Children.

S&P Global and CWD organized a day long activities for our kids and their Mothers. It included a Mother’s meeting in the morning where a lady doctor was invited to talk about the importance of “Health and Hygiene”. Mother’s were asked to give up age old gender biases towards male child and treat both the girls and boys equally. They should also work towards educating the girl child to improve the standard of life and thus changing the society. Post lunch there were activities, games, competitions and performances by children. Kids were served Lunch and were given gifts/ prizes.

In addition to the above many more activities were organized for the sponsored Children.

### **Material Aid**

Educational aid was given in the form of books, school uniforms and other stationery items. In addition, regular coaching classes were given by the social workers at “Pragati”.

Nutritional aid was given in the form of milk, fruits, porridge, semolina etc. In addition bread, biscuits and jams were distributed at regular intervals.
