About Us

Children of the World Delhi (CWD) is a nonpolitical, secular and not-for-profit NGO, registered under the Societies Registration Act No. XXI of 1860. CWD is recognized as a 'specialized adoption agency' by Central Adoption Resource Authority (CARA), Ministry of Women and Child Development, Government of India.

CWD aims to help abandoned, orphaned and destitute children by way of adoption, sponsorship and community development projects in the Delhi national capital region (NCR).

CWD is committed to the UN Declaration on Children's Rights, specifically their rights to special protection, social and material security, care and positive conditions for growing up.

CWD traces its origins to the Norwegian Korean Association (founded in 1953 during the Korean War) and its subsequent avatar, Children of the World Norway (founded in 1978). CWD Secretary Mrs. Mohini Raghunath, helped in establishing Children of the World Bombay in August 1984, and subsequently, helped in establishing Children of the World Delhi in 1991.

Mission

Help children born in difficult circumstances find immediate and lasting love, care and family support so that they grow up to become happy, healthy, educated, socially-responsible and financially independent individuals.

WHAT WE DO

Childcare

A residential childcare centre, Mamta is the first port-of call for babies who are lost, rendered homeless, relinquished or abandoned due to poverty, parental deaths or breakdown in family relations. Such children are referred to Mamta by the police, Child Welfare Committee, hospitals and other childcare institutions, and even by parents and relatives.

At Mamta, children are provided round-the clock care, protection, shelter, medical aid and rehabilitation facilities till such a time that they find a loving home in India or a foreign country. There are typically 20-25 children at Mamta awaiting adoption at any given point of time. The centre has a team of qualified social workers, nurses, attendants and a doctor-on-call to look after the needs of the children.



Adoption

The concept of adoption rests on the idea that children thrive best in families rather than in orphanages or childcare institutions. The rationale being that the loving, nurturing and protective care provided by a family is the ideal soil for a child to grow and realize their full potential.

This principle has been our work's guiding leitmotif. When we receive a child in our care, our first priority is, if possible, to restore the child to his or her biological family. If that's not possible, only then, do we look for prospective adoptive parents (PAPs) with the assistance of CARA.

Over the years, CWD has helped scores of children reunite with their families. We have also helped hundreds of children find loving adoptive families in India and abroad. In the last three decades of our work, our 'rehoming adoption' rates are statistically zero, which reflects favourably on the rigour of our home study process.

WHAT WE DO

Sponsorship

At CWD, sponsorship is basically an education-based programme where children from financially depressed families are encouraged to remain in school and off the streets; strengthen their family bonds; and enlarge their friend circle and world view.

The sponsorship programme (named Pragati) is presently operational in Manglapuri, a low-income urban community in south-west Delhi, where about 100 children from the poorest sections are receiving aid.

Pragati, which is basically a 'remedial class', helps cover the costs of school fees, uniforms, shoes, bags, nutritional supplements, books and stationery.

Additionally, coaching classes, counseling sessions, vocational training, medical camps and extra-curricular activities are arranged for sponsored children and their families.

The progress of sponsored children is closely monitored, and incentives, in the form of gifts and prizes, are given to those who fare well academically. The sponsors keep in touch with children and follow their growth journey through progress reports, which they receive twice a year.

Pragati operates from a field office located in Manglapuri, rented specially for the purpose, and is run by a lean team comprising a full-time professional social worker and two teachers.





MAMTA

Adoption programme

CWD is a 30-year old Government of India licensed adoption agency based out of Delhi

Mamta is the residential childcare centre of CWD. It provides care and protection to destitute, abandoned and unwanted children in the age group zero to six years.

The main objective of Mamta is to look after children who need not only immediate shelter and protection but also long term rehabilitation through adoption. Efforts are made to restore the child to its biological family, failing which the child is put up for adoption.

Children are admitted to Mamta by the order of the child welfare committee (CWC). At the time of admission, children are often in a state of trauma and require immediate medical attention and psychological counseling. Each child under our custody undergoes a thorough medical examination.

We maintain detailed medical examination reports (MERs) and child study reports (CSRs) of each and every child, which are then, when the time comes, shared with their adoptive parents.

Dr. Sricha Sharma, our consulting paediatrician, takes care of all health-related issues, including regular immunization of our children. CWD is extremely grateful to Dr. Sharma for her commitment and work.

Mamta is equipped to provide quality, all-round care for infants, toddlers, older children and children with special needs. Great attention is paid to keep the residential environment clean. The food menu is planned to provide balanced nutrition and taste for children of all ages.

For toddlers, a variety of activities are in place to enhance their mental and physical development. Older children attend a nearby government school, and are kept busy with indoor and outdoor activities.

We are grateful to our band of dedicated volunteers such as Ms. Sara Fattoretto, Ms. Valentina Wendy Costa, Mr. Mauro, Ms. Yulia Chyndyaykina and Mr. Carlo Pinton. These CWD well-wishers plan picnics and undertake creative activities (such as arts, crafts, music and dance) for older children on a regular basis.

MAMTA

Adoption programme

From time to time, children with special needs are also admitted into Mamta. These children are largely considered 'unadoptable' as they don't find favour with prospective adoptive parents in India.

Even though we are not equipped to handle such children, we do everything within our means to ensure that they are rehabilitated and are not denied the chance of finding adoptive parents in the future.

These children are enrolled at UDAI-Working Together School, which provides rehabilitative programmes in occupational, physiotherapy and speech therapies.






Children at Mamta | 2019-20

PRAGATI

Sponsorship programme

Pragati is an umbrella programme aiming to support the children and families coming from low socio-economic background. Under this umbrella, several programmes are run such as remedial classes for children, nutritional aid, guidance and support for TB patients.

CWD runs a 'remedial class' for children of school-going age from financially depressed families in Manglapuri, an urban village in south-west Delhi. The primary objective of this project is to promote education and health of children, and strengthen their familial bonds through sponsorship.

Children are selected for the sponsorship programme according to their economic status, motivation of families to send children to school, length of stay in the community, and all round cooperation with the social worker. Most of these children are first-generation school goers as their parents have little or no educational background. At present, the strength of our remedial class is 110 students.

Pragati is being supported by International Adoption Italy, Ms. Vrinda Sundaram, Mr. Raghvendra Shivhare and many other generous donors.

The above mentioned entities and individuals have sponsored 37 of our 110 remedial classes for children.

A team consisting of two social workers and a para-professional implement and manage the programme in a small classroom in Manglapuri. Children come to the centre after school hours, where they are coached and helped with their homework. Additionally, they are exposed to extra-curricular activities and vocational training.

Extra-curricular activities are encouraged at Pragati to enhance the confidence, and leadership skills of the children. Children learn to sing and dance, draw and paint, create traditional arts and crafts, and do yoga. The children are coached to present competitive skits, dances and musical performances on special occasions.

Picnics and educational excursions are organized to keep the children engaged and broaden their world view. Festivals and national holidays are celebrated at the centre with the active participation of the children.

Pragati also serves freshly made nutritious meals to the children at the centre.

PRAGATI

Sponsorship programme

CWD works with the families of the sponsored children, educating them about ways to improve their employment skills, enhance their living conditions and secure a better future for their children.

They are encouraged to participate in discussions concerning hygiene and health, gender equality, superstition, child marriage and other current critical social issues which have a direct bearing on their lives.

Workshops such as Self Defense Training and Career Counseling are conducted with the support of district authorities and social sector professionals.

Awareness programmes and special days to include the senior citizens and parents of the students are organized. This year, Senior Citizens Day, Grandparents Day and Children's Day were celebrated. These workshops help in capacity building of the community – make them aware of their responsibilities, duties and rights, and empower them to avail of services under various programmes initiated by the Government.

Vocational training pertaining to computers and tailoring are conducted on a regular basis to empower mothers and siblings of sponsored children.


An annual medical camp is organized to address major health issues within the Manglapuri community. Disease diagnosis and treatment are made available at their doorstep at a subsidized or virtually no cost.

Since tuberculosis is rampant in Manglapuri, a health programme is run for family members of TB patients. They are provided with health aid, medical assistance, counseling, nutritional aid including breakfast (glass of milk, banana, and egg). The results of this intervention have been heartening. CWD has seen patients completely recover from TB and pursue active, happy and healthy lives.

Mamta centre large The receives amounts of grocery items - fruits, vegetables, cereals, and other packaged food - from our patrons on a regular meeting the basis. After requirements of our Mamta children, we share the surplus grocery items with needy families - at the bottom of the economic pyramid in the Manglapuri community - who find it difficult to put two square meals on the table.


